

Dear parents,

In order to keep our costs low and minimize the amount of fundraising needed, we are asking you to keep this list posted to your refrigerator or bulletin board, and try to help us not to have to purchase supplies. On Galveston, the first weekend of every month is Garage Sale at the Salvation army and all clothing is only \$1.00! Also, items in the parking lot are make an offer.

Also, most of you will be doing spring cleaning and other will begin having garage sales every weekend. Here's the list. All parents will receive a sketch of costuming ideas, but if your child is a fairy, a thrift store is a great place to pick up one of those chifony like nightdresses (with a liner underneath) in white or any pastel color. The rest of the list is items needed or wanted for the set:

- 1. SHEETS! We need as many flat sheets as possible! Thrift stores and garage sales are great for these. If anyone has some peach or faded yellow, let us know, but we can't have too many white sheets!**
- 2. Anything that looks like a tree**
- 3. Silk or plastic leaves, ivy, fern, moss,, etc**
- 4. Silk or plastic flowers of any size shape or color**
- 5. Silver garland (like the kind at Christmas with stars)**
- 6. Silver glitter or metallic confetti**
- 7. Glow in the dark stars, or other stars, all shapes and sizes**
- 8. Scraps or lengths of material, pastel or dark, no print.**
- 9. Ribbon or crepe ribbon, brown to wrap around bare wood, shiny or crinkly, pastel or bright, printed or not. We love ribbons!**
Also, to embellish costumes, if you have any leftover craft items of any kind like small flowers, iron on patches, craft glue, glue guns, fabric paint, natural beading materials like shells or feathers would be grand!
- 10. PAINT OF ANY COLOR FOR SCENE PAINTING! I can't emphasize that enough. Paint is expensive, and we'll take any color and make it work. Of course it should not be outdoor or toxic paint. Paintbrushes, rollers and especially SPONGES, even bits!**
- 11. We would like to have some green fake grass outdoor carpeting, used is great!**
- 12. If anyone has one of those machines for babies that projects stars on to the ceiling, or anything similar, that would be wonderful.**
- 13. Also, a disco ball, (if you don't know what I'm talking about, ask someone older), would really make the fairy scenes great.**
- 14. Small flashlights, two for each fairy, a dozen wouldn't be too many.**
- 15. If anyone has a giant round mirror we could use, I promise we would take care of it – (no frame or cheap frame).**
- 16. Two portable basketball hoops to use for two characters to slide down like a firepole. Both kids are small.**
- 17. We need three sawhorses for the Jr. Drama production.**
- 18. Posterboard and cardboard, as much as we can get. Stiff paper or fabric is great, too.**

19. We also need brown paper bags unless we get a lot of brown paint for Jr. Drama.
20. We need old screen or chickenwire and drywall mud, or good paper mache mix and paper or newsprint to make rocks and boulders.
21. We could use a couple of backless benches, kid size or slightly bigger. Enough for 6 people.
22. Large balloons or other large forms for paper mache acorn cups or hollowed out logs.
23. Flat pillows, carpet squares, or anything else you could come up with to make a safe climbing path for the fairies.
24. A small hard plastic children's pool.
25. Anything at all you might possibly throw away – if we can't use it now we'll definitely use it next year.
